



Clayton Elden Philip Orr






Special Event Red Thunder Dance Troupe September 16, 1993




Through special funding, Mrs. Youngchief made it possible for Red Thunder, the only professional native dance troupe in Canada, to storm our gym on September 16, 1993. Lee Crowchild led the group with a running narration on costumes, dance, language, culture, and legend.

Everyone participated in the round dance in which the entire gym floor was writhing with intertwining circles of students, teachers, and dancers. The most popular of the traditional dances was the Hoop Dance because of its speed and intricate moves. The native students presented parting gifts of Creations rugs to the dancers at the end of their performance.



On November 18, 1993 the Inner City Theatre Group performed a dramatic, real-life play here at F. G. Miller. They acted out real-life family problems concerning drugs, alcohol and abuse. The music was original and the acting was dramatic (most was taken from the actors real situations). A question period offered an opportunity to ask any questions on the topic of family violence and the actors personal stories. Because the performers were inner city teenagers and not professional actors, question period was difficult. The goal of the group was, however, to try to help others understand the plight of those less fortunate people of the inner city. 


Teams Recognized for Achievements



November 10, 1993



Junior Boys County Cup Champs!

Crusader Teacher Receives Excellence in Teaching Award—

In the late fall of 1993 parents, teachers, and students combined forces to nominate Mrs. Cheri Lindquist for the Excellence in Teaching award. A nomination form was forwarded to the selection committee with letters written by Mrs. Diane Anderson, Mr. Jim Hawkins, Mrs. Gwen Werstiuk, Mrs. Carol Kadutski, Mr. Ted Cabaj, and Miss Candace Ference. Approximately 400 applications were received and Mrs. Lindquist's application made the 125 finalists and went on to become one of the 20 award winners. She received her award on May 7, 1994 in Edmonton.

Mrs. Lindquist has been teaching for 9 years. She taught her first year in Elk Point as Miss Cheri Tokariuk in 1979-80 as a home economics teacher. In that first year she was involved in the production of the yearbook, and the formation of a cheerleading squad. She moved on to teach in Stettler for three years and St.

Albert for one and a half years ending in 1985 only to return to our school as Mrs. Cheri Lindquist in 1989. Mrs. Lindquist is now job sharing with Mrs. Gwen Werstiuk in our home economics department. Mrs. Lindquist's specialty is in the clothing and textiles area.

Mrs. Lindquist has been actively involved with the Class of ceremonies (this will be her fourth year as advisor). In the past few years she has helped Mr. Hellquist with the senior high Students' Union and has advised the junior high Students' Union this year. A youth group was formed last year in which Mrs. Lindquist played an integral part. She also belongs to the Spirit Committee in the school. Mrs. Lindquist has organized pep rallies and activity days for the students including the first skating pep rally at the arena. Other organizations and activities Mrs. Lindquist has been actively involved in range from the P.T.A., past president of the Home Ec. Association, 4-H leader, fair board convenor of the sewing section,

school social committee, and time tabling committee. She is also very active in the clubs and organizations in which her children belong.
